
### VFC Program Overview



- Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program helps provide vaccines to children whose parents or guardians may not be able to afford them.
- Ensure that all children have a better chance of getting their recommended vaccinations on schedule.
- Vaccines available are approved by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP).
- CDC buys vaccines at a discounted rate -> distributes them to providers at no cost -> VFC providers administer vaccines at no cost to eligible children.
- VFC vaccines are purchased with federal funds by West Virginia and is provided to VFCenrolled providers at no charge.



# Proper refrigerated and frozen vaccine storage temperatures.

### Between 36°F–46°F (2°–8°C) for refrigerated vaccine. Between -58°F and +5°F (-50°C and -15°C) for frozen vaccine.
