#### What is a Community Chief Health Strategist?

- A Community Chief Health Strategist is a person or entity who leads an entire community toward healthier status and outcomes.
- BUT, Community Chief Health Strategist is not as much a title or position in the traditional sense of Class and Comp as it is a culture of
  - Innovation
  - Transformation
  - Convening and Collaborating
  - ... with one goal in mind better health for everyone!

# What does a Community Health Strategist Do?

- Promote public health and wellness for all people in the community
- Collect and share data related to the health of the community
- Assess workforce needs
- Collaborate with a range of community partners to build an integrated and effective system that leads to healthier communities

## How do we become Community Chief Health Strategists?

- Transform
  - Become a modern, lean, quality driven, accountable organization
- Assess
  - Learn the community's demographics and health indicators
  - Get the best and most recent data, expanding not-previously-accessed sources
- Collaborate
  - Establish a close working relationship with the health care sector
  - Expand partnerships into areas not usually linked to public health
- Operationalize
  - Consider interventions that have the strongest evidence of efficacy
